# MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

### Dear Friends,

As we adapted to a second year of COVID related protocols and procedures we were reminded of the power of human connection. For years we had brought educators to the classroom, our resources to community events and embraced individuals and families at our Healing Springs Recovery Center. In March 2020 things changed.

By 2021 we found small joys and innovation. While our faces were often covered, and we reached out through a monitor, connections were made and sustained. As I looked over the images and updates in this 2021 Annual Report I am immensely heartened by the breadth of services and creativity our staff brought to their programs.

We actually grew our peer services at Healing Springs Recovery Center from one peer professional in January 2021, to a total of 4 full-time peers supported by several interagency grants. Our peers and the Family Support Navigator worked in concert to support families and their loved one as they sought services. Our on-line programs enabled people in communities from remote areas of the county, and beyond, to participate in our recovery community.

We expanded our Student Assistance Program to work with students in the Galway Central School District. Our lessons on social and emotional health are vital at this time, and our educators bring the Too Good For Drugs curriculum to more districts than ever before.

The greater Saratoga region is blessed with numerous agencies dedicated to empowering individuals and families in securing mental health and addiction related services. Our work could not be done without those partnerships.

■ Worked with Town/Village of Corinth to have A PERMANENT DRUG-DROP BOX installed at Jessup's Landing EMS in Corinth. • YOU(th) Decide - Virtual presentations on Underage Gambling Prevention reached NEARLY 650 STUDENTS AT 7 SCHOOL DISTRICTS in Saratoga County. ● Members and guests attended **OVER 37** ADDICTION-RECOVERY GROUPS AND SOBER SOCIAL EVENTS at Healing Springs Recovery Center. • 490 FAMILIES WERE ASSISTED BY OUR FAMILY SUPPORT NAVIGATORS in supporting their loved one from active addiction to recovery. • NEARLY 750 INDIVIDUALS UTILIZED OUR CERTIFIED RECOVERY PEER ADVOCATE (CRPA) services to either begin, or further, their recovery from addiction. ● Our CRPA, imbedded at Saratoga County Jail, ENGAGED WITH 190 NEW INMATES TO DISCUSS THEIR RECOVERY WITH 43 INDIVIDUALS transferring to a treatment center in place of incarceration. Another 327 INDIVIDUALS RECEIVED REFERRALS to addiction related services post-incarceration. ● Recovery Advocacy In Saratoga (RAIS) led the annual Overdose Awareness Vigil in late August in Congress Park with NEARLY 100 INDIVIDUALS, CLERGY AND COMMUNITY LEADERS participating. ● Overdose Awareness Day was held on August 31st with our community partners. 11 NARCAN TRAINING SITES were held across Saratoga County resulting in NEARLY 200 NARCAN KITS distributed. ● In October, the 4th Annual Dan Provost Memorial Walk was held at Gavin Park with OVER 125 FRIENDS AND FAMILY OF THE PROVOSTS. Education, outreach and fundraising! • 23 VOLUNTEERS PROVIDED 2.430 HOURS OF SERVICE at Healing Springs Recovery Center. ● Throughout the year, OVER 800 NARCAN TRAININGS were held and 892 NARCAN KITS were distributed. • Our Street Outreach CRPA assisted 56 HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS in connecting with addiction treatment services. 

Beginning in July, our Community Outreach CRPA focused in the Corinth and South Glens Falls communities working with 165 PEOPLE IN EARLY RECOVERY. Another 600 PEOPLE were reached through community programs and events. ● Also in July, our services expanded to include a Center CRPA who worked with 108 INDIVIDUALS through calls and walk-in meetings with people in early recovery from addiction.

# **Healing Springs Recovery Center**

We began 2021 with peer services provided at the Saratoga County jail and ended 2021 with three more full-time staff working with vulnerable populations among the homeless, rural underserved areas and on-call days/evenings at our Healing Springs Recovery Center.

People joined us remotely, and in-person, for Recovery Dharma, CODA, Coffee with Megan, Recovery Writing, Tai Chi, Refuge Recovery, Power Hour and ongoing AA/NA/NarAnon meetings.


